
#### My Mode of Transportation To and Around India

I will never forget the love and kindness from this family as well as lessons in life about India.

My life truly changed after I met Mother Teresa on this first visit. It was on this trip that I made a promise to myself that I will try to help poor people the best I can for the rest of my life for the simple reason that at this time, I had two adopted children from Calcutta, India. At the end of the trip, Ann Xavier and I had the honor of escorting a little baby home to its new adoptive family in the USA.



This was the year of school desks. As my trips continued each year, I found myself trying to accomplish bigger projects to help children in India as well as visit new places and find more children in need. It sure was not easy to do.

In the early spring I collected used school desks from St. Joseph School and Medford Vocational School in Medford, MA. We loaded the desks in a large donated truck and I drove it to Berea, Kentucky for afternoon schools in the area for children. I also took some desks to Belmont, New Hampshire to a Christian School.

In Calcutta, India, with the help of my friend, Bernard Maung of Don Bosco Ashalayam Home for street boys, we were able to make new school high and low desks plus benches for half the school at the Adarsha Hindi Vidyalaya School this year as the old wooden ones were worn out. The boys at Don Bosco got to learn to fabricate the metal and weld it all together to make the new chairs and desks and the Adarsha Hindi Vidyalaya School received the finished project for the children in each classroom to sit, learn and be comfortable. Bernard worked hard to oversee this project and the Don Bosco boys did a wonderful job. I again visited the many places I do each year in India.





















When the world turned the page from 2019 to 2020 in January, it started out to be a good year. But then March came and people all over the world were getting very sick and dying. Many people had lost family members and stores went out of business and everything was still closed. I did my best here in the USA by sending out a few extra donations to try and help people here. It was only because of your generosity I could do this. I will end this year's writings only to say God Bless the People who passed away or got sick from Covid. I'm sure it was a year that none of us want to remember ...
